Created by Criminal Justice Reform Bill (2018)



Charged with determining how MA can better identify and provide services to children who have experienced trauma



Goal is to prevent future juvenile justice system involvement and support positive life outcomes for youth

WHAT

- A guide for organizations that want to be TIR, including:
 - Principles of being TIR
 - ODomains of operation in which those principles should be applied

WHO


- Intended audience is any child-serving organization in Massachusetts
- Developed by CTTF members with significant input from subject matter experts and child-serving professionals in Massachusetts

WHY

- Many organizations say they are trauma-informed, but it's not clear that everyone means the same thing when they say that
- CTTF developed this Framework to try and support the development of a common understanding for what it really means to be a TIR Organization in Massachusetts




Framework for Trauma Informed and Responsive Organizations






Implementation Challenges

3. Quality Assurance Support




CTTF 2020 Recommendation 1: State Agencies Should Adopt the Framework

- Adopt the Framework's Principles of TIR care
- Implement the Framework in all Domains
- Eventually, require that provider organizations adopt and implement the Framework into RFRs
- Revise policies/procedures in conflict with organizations' ability to implement the Framework






Introducing HandholdMA.org hand Mhold

- A family-friendly website designed for parents/caregivers who are worried about their child's mental health
- Created by a team of mental health and child development experts in partnership with parents who have "been there"
- Partnership between EOHHS, DMH, and OCA

Improving Data Availability: New Juvenile Justice Data Website



- Interactive visualizations display long-term trends at almost all major juvenile justice process points
- Can break data down by race, gender, age, geography
- Provides background information on the data and legislative/policy changes
